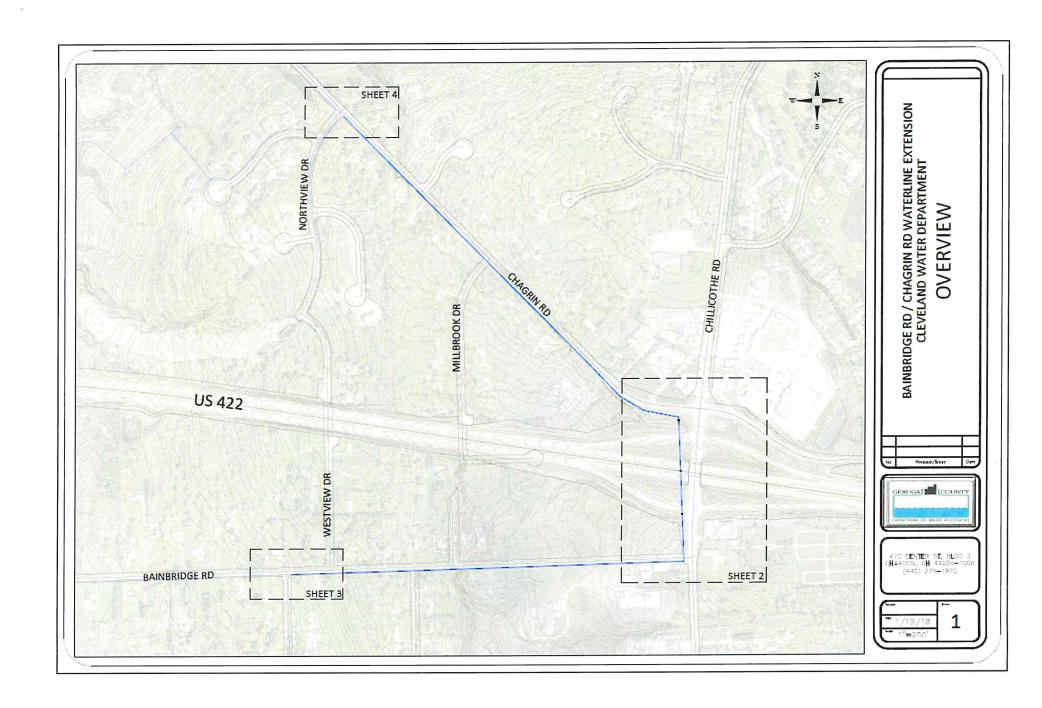


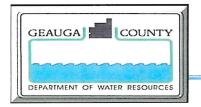
Bainbridge Waterline Loop Closure

Cost Recovery - \$ 1,547,805.20

- Residential tie-in fee is \$ 9,000.00; 41 homes eligible
- Business/commercial/govt fee varies based on size and estimated usage;
 there are 11 sites eligible.
- Eligible customers were notified in July 2021 of tie-in fee for their structure(s). This fee does not include cost of permit and installing the waterline from the building to the water main.

If all eligible parcels tie-in, the County will collect \$ 604,000.00 in fees.
